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#### **DISTRICT 7 4-H LEADERSHIP LAB**

#### **PARTICIPANT AGE**

The participant must be at least 13 years of age by the date of Leadership Lab.

# **FEES**

The cost will be \$300 per person for youths and adult chaperones. This includes all meals beginning with dinner on Tuesday and ending with breakfast on Friday, insurance, activity fees, lodging and facility use fees. **NO REFUNDS** after registration has been made on 4-H Connect.

#### **Chaperones:**

We must abide by the 1:8 ratios for adult chaperones. Program assistance and Adult summer interns are welcome to attend.

#### **RELEASE FORMS**

Every participant, **youth and adult**, will complete a Health and Release form packet. Heath and Release forms will be made available during the 4-H Connect registration process and on our website.

- Original forms must be submitted to the District Office by the due date which will be turned into the 4-H center
- A copy of these forms should accompany the participant to and from camp.

### **TRANSPORTATION**

Buses will be used to transport participants to and from Lab. Counties are responsible for arranging transportation to the bus pick up location.

- Both buses will originate from the Texas A&M AgriLife Research & Extension Center in San Angelo on US Highway 87 North.
- Drop-off on Tuesday, June 27<sup>th</sup> Bring a sack lunch
  - Participants arrive by 7:30 AM (busses leaving at 8:00 AM Sharp!)
- Pick-up on Friday, June 28th
  - Arrival time to be announced...

#### **DRESS CODE**

- Counties will be asked to bring <u>Chips or Cookies</u> for camp which will be collected when loading the bus. Assignments will be made after registration has been received.

- Fireworks, Ropes, Roping Dummies, Water Balloons, Water Guns, Silly String, etc.
- Expensive jewelry/accessories
- Excessive food/drinks

# **ELECTION OF OFFICERS**

One of the major events of lab will be the election of officers for the District 7 4-H Council. Interested applicants should submit one copy of the *District 7 4-H Council Officer Application Form* to the District Office by the due date. All applicants (if eligible according to standing rules) will be presented as candidates for the office(s) they choose. Nomination from the floor will not be accepted. All eligible applicants will be introduced and allowed the opportunity to give a talk on 4-H, the length of which will be up to three (3) minutes. Election will be done by secret ballot. An interview will also be conducted for each candidate running for office. Each candidate can bring one poster board size campaign poster - NO candy, gum, buttons, giveaways, etc. will be allowed.

Each person running for an office will receive more details from the District Office concerning the election.

\* If you are running for office, you are expected to add the required dates to your personal calendar.

# **REQUIRED WORKSHOPS/TRAINING**

The District Council <u>President</u>, 1<sup>st</sup> <u>Vice-President and Delegate-at-Large</u> also serve as State Officers on the Texas 4-H Council and must be 16 years of age and not reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before **August 31, 2017**. Must also be in the 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, or 12<sup>th</sup> grade for the year serving on Texas 4-H Council. **State Officers** are <u>required</u> to attend the State 4-H Council workshop. If you cannot attend this training you <u>cannot</u> run for these three offices.

All other officers must be 15 years of age and not reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before August 31, 2017. <u>All</u> District 7 Officers are <u>required</u> to attend the events outlined in the District Council Agreement.]

#### **INTERVIEW FOR OFFICER CANDIDATE RULES**

- Each interview shall be no longer than six (6) minutes in length and shall be conducted during the allotted time for interviews.
- The interviewers shall be facilitated by the three officers who currently represent the District on the Texas 4-H Council: President, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President and Delegate-at-Large. The council advisors shall be present to monitor the interview. Interviews will take place in front of all voting delegates.
- If a current State Council Officer is running for a lower office the next year, he or she will not be allowed to conduct the interview.
- There will be four (4) questions per interview three (3) predetermined questions related to the applicants leadership, community service and project work and one (1) question that will be

drawn from a list of questions. All questions shall pertain to 4-H, the resume submitted by the delegate or the candidates future plans for the District after obtaining a position on Council.

- The dress for the interview shall be Professional Casual.
- Every candidate running for office must be present at District 7 Leadership Lab to participate in the speech and interview portion to become an officer.
