# DISTRICT 7 4-H ROUNDUP CONTESTS GUIDELINES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### **AGE DIVISIONS**

The following contestant ages are as of August 31, 2018:

- JUNIOR age 8 and in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade to 8<sup>th</sup> grade
- SENIOR 9<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> grades (Max age 18 as of August 31)

All counties must be entered on 4-H Connect. Each county will submit an entry form to the District Office with entries.

There will be NO REFUNDS for teams/individuals that don't show up to the contest or for meals. If you miss the registration deadline you will be required to pay the late registration fee.

The following Roundup Contests will be held separate from District 4-H Roundup: Beef Quiz Bowl, Horse Quiz Bowl, Leaders 4 Life Skill-a-thon, Nutrition Quiz Bowl, Consumer Judging, Food Challenge, Horse Judging, Livestock Judging, Livestock Skill-a-thon, Meat Judging, Mohair Judging, Range Evaluation, Range and Pasture Grass ID, Wool Judging, and Food Show. The awards for these contests will be awarded at each separate contest and WILL NOT be recognized at the Awards Assembly held at District Roundup.

# **NUMBER OF CONTESTS A 4-H MEMBER CAN ENTER**

A 4-H member can only enter one (1) contest per day at Texas 4-H Roundup (State). See Texas 4-H Roundup Guide for schedule

PLEASE NOTE: Contestants are permitted to compete in <u>1</u> Educational Presentation & <u>1</u> Share the Fun Presentation at District Roundup but it is <u>very likely</u> that the contests will be in two totally different facilities that will require driving.

#### **NUMBER OF ENTRIES**

# NUMBER OF SENIOR TEAMS ELIGIBLE FOR STATE COMPETITION

In contests that allow three entries, the top three (3) senior entries will advance, of which, one, two, or all three entries could possibly come from the same county within the district. Mixing of individuals from various counties to create district "all star" team(s) is not allowed.

# **NUMBER OF SENIOR INDIVIDUALS ELIGIBLE FOR STATE COMPETITION**

In judging and identification contests, the three (3) highest scoring senior individuals in the district contest may participate. A county is allowed to advance a maximum of two (2) individuals. If a county has three individuals wishing to compete at the county/district level they must be declared as a team entry. EXCEPTION —Duds to Dazzle, Food Challenge, Quiz Bowls and Leaders 4 Life do not allow individual entries.

#### **CONTEST TIME LIMITS**

There is no <u>minimum</u> time for Junior or Senior presentations. <u>Maximum</u> time is as follows (which <u>may</u> be a factor in judging):

• Educational Presentations 12 minutes for presentation; 9 minutes for set-up/tear-down

Public Speaking
 7 minutes for presentation

• Share-the-Fun 6 minutes for presentation; 4 minutes for set-up/tear-down

# **EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION & PUBLIC SPEAKING**

Refer to the Texas 4-H Roundup Guide for specific rules for each <u>Educational Presentation</u> contest and Public Speaking contest.

- Agricultural Technology & Farm Safety Educational Presentation
- Animal Science Educational Presentation
- Beef Educational Presentation
- Health & Wellness Educational Presentation
- Horse Educational Presentation
- Open Educational Presentation

- Open Agriculture & Natural Resources Educational Presentation
- Open Family Community Health Educational Presentation
- Promote 4-H Educational Presentation
- Public Speaking (Not an Educational Presentation Category)
- Safety & Injury Prevention Educational Presentation

**ENTOMOLOGY IDENTIFICATION:** 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade through 8<sup>th</sup> Grade will use the Junior Contest Format and 9<sup>th</sup> Grade through 12<sup>th</sup> Grade will use the Senior Contest Format.

VIDEO, AUDIO, AND DISPLAY EQUIPMENT: A laptop and projector will be provided in each Educational Presentation Room. If you want to use the equipment on site, you will need to bring your presentation on a jump drive. Please note that there is always the risk of technical difficulties. You are welcome to bring all of your own equipment (computer, projector, and extension cord) if you feel more comfortable using your own equipment. Keep in mind you either have to use the equipment on site or bring your own – we cannot connect your computer to their projector.

<u>Educational Presentations</u> in each room will compete against each other for a Division Champion Award. One Division Champion Award will be presented in each contest ROOM for each age group for <u>educational presentations only.</u>

#### **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

Refer to the Texas 4-H Roundup Guide for specific rules for this contest.

#### **SHARE-THE-FUN**

Share-the-Fun Contest allows for two entries per category from each district. Refer to the Texas 4-H Roundup Guide for specific rules for each Share-the-Fun category. There are no guaranties as far as room set-up available features, such as: flooring, acoustics, space, etc.

- 7 categories:
  - Choreographed Routines
  - Dramedy
  - Poetry/Prose
  - Vocal
  - Solo/Band Performance
  - Celebrate 4-H
  - Musical Instrumental
- The *first and second place senior district winners* in each of the seven (7) categories qualify for State 4-H Roundup.
- The first and second place entries in each category from District advancing to State may be from the same county.

All Share-the-Fun Teams/Individuals need to supply all necessary stage equipment and props (i.e. microphone stands, radio/tape/cd players, etc.).

A piano will be available for use this year.

Coaches and agents of Share-the-Fun Teams/Individuals should make sure that the skit meets the category guidelines as addressed in the Share-the-Fun section of the Texas 4-H Roundup Rules and Guidelines.

Again this year, select Share-the-Fun Teams/Individuals will perform during the Awards assembly. There will be **ONE** Team/Individual selected by the judges from each contest **CATEGORY** to perform.

# **SENIOR FASHION SHOW**

This contest will be available at District 4-H Roundup. See the District 7 Fashion Show letter for further instructions. In order to facilitate District Fashion Show all agents are asked to cooperate with those 4-H members who are competing in Fashion Show and doing an Educational Presentation. Fashion Show contestants are to be instructed to report to their Fashion Show Superintendent to be assigned a judging time. They will then check in with their Educational Presentation Superintendent and turn in their Fashion Show judging time. As a contest superintendent, please honor this judging time as closely as possible.

#### **SENIOR FASHION STORYBOARD**

This contest will be available at District 4-H Roundup. See the District 7 Fashion Show letter for further instructions.

# JUDGES/JUDGING

Volunteers and County agents will serve as judges for district roundup. Any volunteer judges can be submitted using the online judges form. The district office will make judging assignments and information will be provided to the judges.

Judges should be individuals qualified to judge Educational Presentations, Public Speaking or Share-the Fun presentations. They should have experience working with these contests and/or have particular expertise in an area. Ideally, the best judge would meet both criteria.

# **ASSIGNMENTS**

Information regarding agent assignments, contest room location, etc. will be sent to all agents after we receive registration materials and review the number of entries in each contest.

# **SUPERINTENDENTS**

Contest superintendents are responsible for conducting their respective contests. Orientation will be provided for judges while superintendents are preparing for contests.

Contest superintendents are to ask participants and parents/leaders to remain in their designated contest room until all Educational Presentations have been given. This will ensure an audience for all participants as well as provide an opportunity for all 4-H members to observe their competition.

# **AGENT/PARENT/LEADER RESPONSIBILITIES**

It is important that all 4-H members participating in District Roundup be under the supervision of parents or leaders from the time they are dismissed from their contests until the Awards Assembly begins.

Roundup contests should provide positive experiences for 4-H members. The contests are designed to provide 4-H members the opportunity to demonstrate project skills and help them develop poise and self-confidence in making 4-H presentations. We know you will encourage participation in all Roundup contests.
