PARTICIPANT AGE

The participant must be at least **13 years of age** by the date of Leadership Lab.

FEES

The cost will be \$200 per person for youths and \$150 for agents. This includes all meals beginning with lunch on Wednesday and ending with breakfast on Friday, insurance, activity fees, lodging and facility use fees. This fee **DOES NOT** include transportation. Counties will be responsible for coordinating transportation to and from Lab. **NO REFUNDS** after registration has been made on 4-H Online.

Chaperones:

We must abide by the 1:8 ratios for adult chaperones. Program assistance and Adult summer interns are welcome to attend.

RELEASE FORMS

Every participant, **youth and adult**, will complete a Health and Release form packet. Health and Release forms will be made available on our website.

- **Forms must be submitted to the District Office by the due date which will be turned into the camp facility.**
- **A copy of these forms should accompany the participant to and from camp.**

WHAT TO BRING

- Pillow, sheets, towels, wash cloths, and a light blanket
- Spending money for concession shop.
- Swimsuit, Sturdy Tennis Shoes, Sunscreen, Chapstick

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Electronic Devices (including, but not limited to, cell phones, music players, video games, etc.)
- Fireworks, Ropes, Roping Dummies, Water Balloons, Water Guns, Silly String, Baby Powder, etc.
- Expensive jewelry/accessories
- Excessive food/drinks

DRESS CODE

AGENTS

Agents, you are not on vacation. You are here to build kids up and insure that they have the best camp experience possible. Please take your job very seriously. You will need to register through 4-H Connect and complete the Health & Release Forms.



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ELECTION OF OFFICERS

One of the major events of lab will be the election of officers for the District 7 4-H Council. Interested applicants should submit one copy of the *District 7 4-H Council Officer Application Form* to the District Office by the due date. All applicants (if eligible according to standing rules) will be presented as candidates for the office(s) they choose. Nomination from the floor will not be accepted. All eligible applicants will be introduced and allowed the opportunity to give a talk on 4-H, the length of which will be up to three (3) minutes. An interview will also be conducted for each candidate running for office immediately following each candidate speech. Each candidate can bring one poster board size campaign poster - NO candy, gum, buttons, giveaways, etc. will be allowed. Election will be done by secret ballot.

- **State Elected- At Large Delegate Positions:** If a 4-H member gets elected to one of the 6 “At Large” Texas 4-H Council Positions that are elected at Texas 4-H Roundup, that member is not allowed to run for a District Council Officer Position.

*** If you are running for office, you are expected to add the required dates to your personal calendar.**

REQUIRED WORKSHOPS/TRAINING

The District Council President & 1st Vice-President also serve on the Texas 4-H Council and must be 16 years of age, and not be older than 18 as of **August 31, 2024**. **These 2 are required to attend the entire Texas 4-H Council workshop.** If you cannot attend this training, you **cannot** run for these two offices.

All other officers must be 15 years of age and not be older than 18 as of August 31, 2024. **All-District 7 Officers are required to attend the events outlined in the District Council Agreement.**

INTERVIEW FOR OFFICER CANDIDATE RULES

- Each interview shall be no longer than six (6) minutes in length and shall be conducted during the allotted time for interviews.
- The interviewers shall be facilitated by the two officers who currently represent the District on the Texas 4-H Council: President, 1st Vice-President. The council advisors shall be present to monitor the interview. Interviews will take place in front of all voting delegates.
- 4-H members who have previously served on Texas 4-H Council are not allowed to run for another District Council position.
- There will be four (4) questions per interview – three (3) predetermined questions related to the applicant’s leadership, community service, and project work and one (1) question that will be drawn from a list of questions.
- The dress for the interview shall be Professional Casual.
- Every candidate running for office must be present at District 7 Leadership Lab to participate in the speech and interview portion to become an officer.
